Alongside dexterous guitar skills and a voice charged with emotion and depth, he pulls his audience into an intimate encounter with God, as the music reveals earthy sounds and heavenly narratives. Steph has extensive touring and collaborative experience with artists such as Mike Farris, Nathan Jess, Chris McClarney (Jesus Culture), Matt Redman, The Humming People, Rend Collective and Martin Smith, and has been touching hearts around the world with the reaches of God's saving grace. He has also regularly featured on the BBC and UCB among others. He recently launched his own podcast "This Is My Story, This Is My Song", a space dedicated to honest conversations about various life journeys towards faith, the role of creativity in hardships and mental health.
